As part of my project on the attendance of museums and galleries, I have compiled a report based on data on five English museums and galleries.

Overall, we can notice that the appeal for galleries and museums has risen recently, indicated by the fact that most museums have doubled their number of visits in less than four years, and they are still rising at a slower rate. However, the same cannot be said for the National History Museum and the Science Museum who lost 60 and 65 percent of visitors respectively after their introduction of admission charges in 2014.

Compared with others, the Tate Gallery seems to be less popular. In 2013, its number of visitors was below one million. Additionally, we can see that during the period between 2015 and 2017 the increase in yearly visits was not as substantial as during the previous periods. Perhaps the sudden increase between 2013 and 2015 was due to the Natural History Museum and the Science Museum's decision to charge for admission, suggesting they lost their potential visitors.

I would recommend the two museums to draw on their statistics and remove their admission fee. The Tate Gallery may need to improve what it has to offer in order to attract visitors.

In conclusion, the overall situation of the attendance of museums and galleries seems promising. More people visit various museums every ~~the~~ year, but some of them may need to rethink their stance on admission fees.
